2. Find a Co-Leader

- Benefits of Co-Leading

- Meet with your potential co-leader early in the process. Start spending time together, praying together, and brainstorming your vision for the group.

3. Develop a Prayer Team

- Brainstorm a list of several men and women you can count on to be praying for you and your ministry to men
 - Don't forget to talk to them about it!
- Example of Moses in Exodus 17 his arms being literally held up as he prays and intercedes for the nation of Israel
- Example of Jesus praying in the garden the night before His crucifixion
 - o "The battle of Calgary was won in the Garden of Gethsemane."

4. Build Your Group

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

- Begin to pray them out meet with your co-leader to pray on a regular basis for the men that will be in your group
- Make a list of potential men F.A.T. Men
 - <u>Faithful</u> have shown themselves to be faithful in the little things, guys you know from your circles who are known for keeping their word
 - Available can meet when you are going to be holding the group and will commit for the long haul
 - o **Teachable** Genuinely committed to real growth

- Publicize the groups in your church
 - Use every means available to you. Don't let "I didn't know about it" be a viable excuse!
 - Possible publicity materials
 - Bulletin insert, Posters, Flyers
 - Emails
 - Twitter/Facebook/etc.
 - o Be sure to check out the resources available at www.menwithnoregrets.org
- Begin to make the big ask
 - Show the guys a brochure, the first book, talk to them about the benefits of discipleship.
 - Ask for the commitment.
- 5. Get Ready for the First Meeting
 - Have your materials ready
 - Order all the books you will need from <u>www.menwithnoregrets.org</u>, enough for each man to have his own copy of the study guide and the supplemental book(s).

- Initial materials needed: Book #1 Becoming a Fully Devoted Follower of Christ and the corresponding supplemental, Following Christ by Joseph Stowell
- Find a Place to Meet
 - o No distractions, well lit, room to spread out, comfortable seating
 - Name tags (at least until you get to know one another)
- Pray over that first meeting
- Call or email the men the day before and remind them.
